The workshop on Sustainable Work will be held at [TSM Research](#), Université Toulouse Capitole, in Toulouse, France, from June 16 to June 17, 2025. We cordially invite researchers and PhD students to submit abstracts and papers to be presented at the workshop.

The aim of the workshop is to build a multidisciplinary (e.g., management, social psychology, occupational psychology, ergonomics, occupational health) network of French and international researchers to enhance the global understanding of challenges related to sustainable work by integrating diverse theoretical and methodological perspectives.

Sustainable work issues are particularly crucial in an era marked by the development of new forms of organizations and businesses (platforms, cooperatives, liberated companies...), new modes of work organization (remote, hybrid), new management practices (algorithmic management...), as well as the emergence of new tools driven by the rise of AI.

WORKSHOP ORGANIZATION

The workshop will be limited to a small group of active scholars and provide a dynamic setting for mutual discussion, conceptual feedback, development of new research ideas, and building collaborative relationships. Several activities, discussions, and presentations are planned to explore the complex dynamics that influence sustainable work and the conditions of this sustainability, including health and well-being at work, engagement, employability, and workers' adaptability to labor market changes.

We welcome submissions from a wide range of theoretical backgrounds, methodologies, stakeholder perspectives, and disciplinary approaches. Submissions may include early-stage papers presenting new theoretical ideas or preliminary findings, as well as fully developed manuscripts.

24 February, 2025	Deadline for abstract submission Please confirm your intent to participate in the workshop by submitting a 500-word abstract (with title, author name(s), contact, and affiliation(s)). Only submissions in English shall be accepted for review.
17 March 2025	Notification of acceptance/rejection of abstracts A Scientific Committee composed of our invited guests will conduct the selection process.
16 May, 2025	Deadline for final paper submission The maximum length of paper is 40 pages (including ALL tables, appendices and references). Early-stage papers (8-10 pages) are also accepted. Send full paper in one PDF file. Use Times New Roman 12-pitch font, double spaced, and 1-inch (2.5 cm) margin all around. Number all pages.
